

Programme Project Report for each programme is according to the norms and guidelines prescribed by the Commission and wherever necessary by the appropriate regulatory authority having control over the programme

The **Programme Project Report (PPR)** is initially prepared by expert programme coordinators under the norms and guidelines prescribed by the Commission. After drafting, the Head of the Department carefully examines the PPR along with a senior professor from the concerned department, and then the BOS&R of that department approves it.

Following this stage, the **Centre for Internal Quality Assurance** (**CIQA**) plays a crucial role in reviewing and approving the PPR of all programmes. Whenever necessary, the committee may recommend modifications to ensure alignment with quality standards. The CIQA grants the final approval before the official launch of the programme.

In addition to this, the CIQA is entrusted with the responsibility of collecting information from other Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) regarding quality benchmarks, parameters, and best practices. It also organizes workshops and seminars on qualityrelated themes and ensures that proceedings are disseminated across the institution.

Finally, the Academic Council accords its approval to the PPRs of various programmes, completing the process of validation and readiness for implementation.

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Part - X: INNOVATIVE AND BEST PRACTICES

10.1 Innovations introduced during academic years

For ODL Mode:

- 1) First one week online academic orientation programme was organized by the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) from the first week of November 2024 for the students admitted at the Centre for Distance and Education for the session 2024-25.
- 2) Online mentoring session of one hour per week has been organized for the students of all Programmes for ODL programme.
- 3) For the admitted students, the Centre for Distance and Online organizes Personal Contact Programmes (PCPs) during which the teachers of parent departments and the programme co-coordinators take classes and satisfy the queries of the students of CDOE for ODL programmes.
- 4) The students were also connected through WhatsApp, Facebook pages and E-mails and other social media pages.
- 5) Examinations were conducted for theory/practical exams, seminars and viva-voce for ODL Mode Programmes as per requirements.
- 6) Assignments are accepted through the online portal since the session 2018.
- 7) Three tier students grievance cell activated in the Centre for Distance and Online Education.
- 8) The admission criteria and the pass/fail criteria of the ODL programmes are identical to those of the conventional programmes.
- 9) CDOE accepted schemes, syllabi, and course curriculums for all courses at par with the regular courses.
- 10) Currently, the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) offers 03 undergraduate, 08 postgraduate (Online as well as ODL),out of which 03 new PG programmes have been introduced by the CDOE from this current session i.e. 2024-25
- 11) The Centre for Distance and Online Education has launched a new programme to provide greater academic and professional opportunities for learners i.e. MA in Hindi from session 2024-25. Furthermore 11 number of one year Diploma programmes/courses have been introduced for the benefit of students.
- 12) Currently CDOE got approval regarding the extension of territorial jurisdiction from the state government to create examination centers across Harvana to ensure the smooth conduct of examinations.
- 13) The Centre for Distance and Online Education offers several programmes in which the institution's self-learning materials (SLMs) are digitized and uploaded to the website or Learning Management System (LMS), ensuring easy access for students enrolled in online mode programmes.
- 14) Workshops and seminars on quality-related themes were organized and disseminated.
- 15) From the session 2015-16 onwards, the online admission process was adopted to facilitate the students from all over India and abroad.
- 16) The Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) implements the four-quadrant approach for its online programmes—comprising E-Content, E-Tutorial, E-Assessment, and Discussion Forum—in accordance with the UGC Regulations, 2020 (ODL & Online Programmes).

- 8. Five full-flagged online programmes were started from the session January, 2021.
